**Prize Giving:** 5.00pm All prizes awarded even if the day is cancelled.

**Prizes:** 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, ... Snapper, Gurnard, Kahawai and one featured species. Only one of each of these 4 species to be weighed in by each angler.

**The Three Sisters Aggregate prize:** a bucket containing one each of Snapper, Kahawai and Gurnard can be weighed in, one bucket per boat per Competition Day. Any incomplete set on any of the combination of 3 will not be eligible for a prize and your fish must be caught on your boat. The closest to the average of all buckets over the 4 days of competition will win the major prize and the winner will be announced at prize giving at the Easter Competition. A fish weighed in as part of the 3 sisters cannot then be weighed in as an individual species.

## TOURNAMENT RULES – Keep this section for your reference

- **DATE OF COMPETITION:** Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> April / 8<sup>th</sup> save day
- **HIGH TIDE:** 11.00am
- Entries in by Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> April unless max numbers reached
- Skippers pack pickup on the day from 7.30 am upstairs at MMBC
- Briefing 8.00am MMBC 7<sup>th</sup> April / save day 8<sup>th</sup> April
- Weigh station open 12.00pm – 2.00pm (read guidelines)
- Protests - 4pm to lodge any concerns or complaints (read guidelines)
- Prize giving 5pm MMBC club rooms (read guidelines)

All crew must be paid up entrants. **(No Passengers)**

All entries must be on the official entry forms and fees paid in full.

Individually numbered wristbands issued by tournament registration must be worn at all times during tournament events.

All boats must depart and return from the MMBC ramp.

**The number of entrants is limited. Skippers and their boats must be MMBC members but they can include non-member guests.**

### RESPONSIBILITY:

Lifejackets must be worn when crossing the bar (both ways) – anyone seen not doing so, will result in the entire boat being disqualified.

The Skipper is responsible for properly equipping the boat, for the safe operation of the boat and the safety of all on board.

The Skipper is responsible for ensuring compliance with Maritime Safety Rules and Standards; Manawatu River and Tributaries Navigation and Safety Bylaws and Ministry of Fisheries Recreational Fishing Rules. Any boat found to be in breach of these rules will be disqualified.

All entrants must abide by the Manawatu Marine Boating Club Inc's Club rules.

The Skipper is responsible for ensuring that all crew are aware and accept the tournament rules. Your signed entry form to the tournament is confirmation that you and your crew have read and accept the tournament rules and conditions. (Boats and equipment may be scrutinized at the tournament organizers discretion.)

### FISHING METHODS:

Only rods or hand lines with a maximum of 5 hooks per line may be used or carried on the boat. (No setlines, set nets or fish traps to be carried on the boat.)

BOUNDARY: Fishing must be north of the Ohau River (S40° 39.70') and south of the Rangitikei River mouth (S40° 16.78').

**WEIGH IN:**

The weigh station will be open from 12.00pm to 2.00pm. If you have fish to be weighed, you must be standing in the line at the weigh station wearing your wristband before 2.00pm. If there is congestion at the ramp at 2.00pm the weigh-in staff will wait for you to retrieve your boat and weigh your fish, but you must have been inside the 5 knot zone and visible to weigh station staff before 2.00pm not crossing the bar at 2.00pm.

**Only one fish of each species to be weighed per angler. Do not gut, gill or bleed fish.  
No swapping or gifting of fish – you must have caught the fish you weigh in.**

Weigh station staff may cut or gut fish after weighing to confirm fish has been weighed or if tampering is suspected. Any tampering detected will result in immediate disqualification of the boat and its crew from the tournament. Each fish may only be weighed and entered once. If you dispute the weight, state this while the fish is on the scales; the staff will check their reading/recording and their decision will become final. In the event of a tie, the first fish weighed will be deemed the winner.

All Snapper entries to be weighed will have a maximum length of 600mm. Longer snapper, when first caught can be placed on the MMBC fish rulers, with the hand of the angler who caught it showing their wrist band and photographed, then released back into the ocean. Photographs must clearly show the fish, the wristband and the MMBC ruler measurement and text to Jude on: **021 325 499**

**The Three Sisters Aggregate prize:** a bucket containing one each of Snapper, Kahawai and Gurnard can be weighed in, one bucket per boat per Competition Day. Any incomplete set on any of the combination of 3 will not be eligible for a prize and your fish must be caught on your boat. The closest to the average of all buckets over the 4 days of competition will win the major prize to be announced at prize giving on Easter Saturday. A fish weighed in as part of the 3 sisters cannot be weighed in as an individual species.

**CANCELLATIONS:** Will be notified on a board outside the club entrance, broadcast on VHF radio channel 60 and on MMBC Facebook. If **cancelled**, all prizes will be by lottery using the entrants' numbers. If cancelled, skippers who live locally, must still attend at 8.00am to collect the wristbands for their crew, which must be worn at prizegiving.

**PRIZEGIVINGS:** Will be held at 5.00pm upstairs by the pool tables in the boat club. **YOU MUST BE PRESENT AND WEARING YOUR WRISTBAND TO CLAIM A SPOT PRIZE.**

**TIMES:** 7.30am Skippers can collect wristbands for their boat.  
8.00am Safety Briefing

The Coastguard will inspect bar conditions prior to the start regarding the commencement of competition for that day. Times may be delayed or altered on the day by Tournament Organizers and such changes will be noted on a board outside the club entrance and broadcast on VHF Channel 60 and MMBC Facebook.

Any protest must be made in writing to the Fishing Co-Ordinator by 4.00pm on the day of the competition. The decisions of the Tournament Organizers will be final and binding. No correspondence will be entered into.
